Burleson Police apprehended two suspects who allegedly broke into Zale's jewelry outlet store then fled in a stolen vehicle.

TIME/DATE: Saturday, Feb. 11, 2012; 11:30 p.m.

David Espinosa (24, Fort Worth): booked in for burglary of a building; facing multiple charges

Joshua Cortez (22, Fort Worth): booked in for burglary of a building; facing multiple charges

According to the report, the Burleson police telecommunications operator received a call from the Zales' security stating that there were two men wearing hoods who were breaking in to the store. The vehicle involved was described as a dark colored hatchback.

Two Burleson officers located a vehicle matching that description at I-35W and Alsbury Boulevard. The license plate on the vehicle returned as stolen. The officers attempted to stop the vehicle, but the driver fled north on I-35W, exited Seminary Drive then drove through several neighborhoods before crashing in the 600 block of Biddison Street. The vehicle had gone airborne after hitting a bump then landed on its roof against a building.

Officers said Espinosa fled on foot. Officer Mabry and Fort Worth officers were unable to locate Espinosa.

Cortez was pinned under the vehicle, which caught on fire. Burleson officers Mabry and Garrett lifted the vehicle and pulled Cortez to safety. Cortez was transported to a Fort Worth hospital for treatment of injuries. Fort Worth Police handled the crash report.

Espinosa was later found in an emergency room at a Fort Worth hospital. He was transported to the Burleson Police Department for booking.
