If you want to learn more about local veterans in the weeks leading up to the sixth annual Military Veteran Tribute on Nov. 10, the Burleson Public Library is at your service.

Approximately 100 interviews with local military veterans that have been compiled as part of the Burleson Veterans History Project/Operation Remember have been added to the library's DVD collection. DVDs may be checked out for one week at a time. If you have a library card, you may check out up to 10 DVDs at one time.

The videos are currently viewable on the City website, www.burlesontx.com, by clicking on the Meetings & Video icon, Streaming Videos of City Meetings, Speciality tab. The memories of military veterans are preserved thanks to dedicated volunteers, the City's Operation Remember program, and the Library of Congress Veteran History Project. Men and women from the United States Navy, Coast Guard, Army, Air Force and Marine Corps have added their memoirs. Many of the veteran interviews have also been submitted to the Library of Congress.

Since May 2010, volunteers Dale Dexheimer, Milton Gibson and Gary Burton have conducted the interviews. In previous years the work was done by J.W. Arnold and up to half a dozen members of the Burleson Heritage Foundation (BHF). The BHF began compiling veteran histories as part of the Library of Congress' Veterans History Project in 2003. The City and library accelerated the efforts.

The Library of Congress' Veterans History Project was created in 2000 to record the memories of veterans of World War I, World War II, the Korean War, Vietnam War, Persian Gulf War, and the conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan.
