The investigation in to a report that a man pulled his car up to a Bransom Elementary School student as she was walking home from school Tuesday has been closed.

According to the Burleson Police, the man called police Thursday (after the incident was publicized), identified himself, then was interviewed today, Jan. 17. He told police that there were signs up in the neighborhood concerning a lost dog. The man saw the child, with her mother following her, and stopped to ask if she had lost a dog.

The investigation started Wednesday evening, Jan. 15, 2014, when the mother of the third grade girl told a Burleson police officer that a man stopped his vehicle next to her daughter at approximately 3 p.m. on Tuesday, Jan. 14. The interaction took place near the intersection of Parkridge Boulevard and Springhill Drive in Oak Valley. The mother was following her daughter in her vehicle as her daughter was walking home from the elementary school, located at 820 S. Hurst Rd.

The girl's mother told police that she noticed that a silver/gray two door hatchback vehicle had stopped. The girl told her mother that the man - described as a white male in his late 30s or early 40s and balding - asked her if she had lost a puppy and she said no. The man left as the mother parked her vehicle and walked up to the passenger car. The man stayed in his vehicle during the conversation with the child.

The police department notified the Burleson Independent School District Jan. 15, the night that the mother made the report. The school district issued an alert to parents Jan. 16. During the investigation, the Burleson Police Department contacted other law enforcement agencies for assistance and/or tips that could lead to solving the case.
